

## WHAT TO BRING...

- **Bedding:** Sleeping bag or twin sheets, blanket, pillow
- **Toiletries:** Soap, towels, toothbrush & toothpaste, comb/brush, deodorant, shampoo
- **Clothing:** Casual, comfortable clothes for any time, play clothes, shoes, socks, underwear, pajamas, jacket
- **Outside gear:** Winter shoes, coat, gloves, etc.
- **Miscellaneous:** Flashlight, camera, BIBLE, notebook, pen/pencil
- **Label your stuff:** Putting your name on all your belongings will help in recovering lost and found items. What is not picked up will be donated to help others.

## WHAT NOT TO BRING...

- No weapons, guns, knives, fireworks.
- **Leave all electronics at home:** Cell phone, CD player, iPod, MP3 player, video games, etc.
- **Cell Phones** are not permitted, please contact the office with any questions.
- **Bad Attitude:** We are excited for what God has in store for you at this retreat! Please come prepared to dig in to God's word, meet new people, and participate in the weekend's activities.

### WHAT TO EXPECT WHEN YOU BRING YOUR CAMPER:

Go straight down the main road to the Assembly Building.

### ASSEMBLY BUILDING

- Go to the cafeteria and check in with the camp staff
- Pay any remaining balance
- Get bunk assignment
- A **wristband** will be given to each camper. It must be worn during the camper's entire stay at Camp.

### MEDICAL STUFF

- The Medical Form is part of the Registration Form. The Dean and Nurse share these files.
- **Medications** must be given to the **camp nurse**. Please have
- written instructions about all the camper's meds. *Note: All medicine is to be in its original container.*

### SPENDING MONEY?

- **Canteen cards** are not used for Winter Retreat and therefore no canteen money is needed.
- **Missions money** can be sent with your camper to give to the retreat's mission. *\*\*\*We will be collecting special items for missions this year, please see note\*\*\**

**After check in at the Assembly Building, you can settle your camper into their assigned sleeping area.**

### WHAT TO EXPECT WHEN YOU RETRIEVE YOUR CHILD

- Camper's luggage, bedding, etc. will be ready for pickup after check-out. The check-out location will be given at check-in.
- Pick up your camper and all camper medications.
- Check out your camper, and any camper's you are taking home with the camp staff.

### CAMP GUIDELINES:

- Faculty members and campers are to abide by the schedule unless excused by the Dean or Executive Director.
- No one is permitted to leave the camp without the permission of the Dean or Executive Director. With permission, you must sign out at the camp office.
- Any sickness or injury must be reported to the camp nurse.
- No one is to go barefoot on the camp grounds at any time!
- Any camper causing property damage will be held accountable for the cost.
- No food or drinks are allowed in sleeping areas or the chapel.
- **In matters of dress, modesty must prevail at all times.** No halter tops, tube tops, bare midriff, strapless tops, exposed underwear, "short" shorts, or shirts with inappropriate graphics or words. **NO cleavage or buttocks should be visible.**

### CAMP CODE OF CONDUCT:

The following behaviors will NOT be tolerated at Camp. Please report any of the following to the Camp Faculty or Staff **IMMEDIATELY!**

- The use and/or possession of tobacco, drugs, and intoxicants
- Sexual misconduct
- Self harm
- Stealing
- Lying
- Profanity
- Inappropriate language or conversation
- Negative and disrespectful attitudes
- Abuse of any kind (verbal, physical or sexual)
- Bullying
- Gossiping
- Keeping medications
- Cellphones

**The Executive Director and Dean reserve the right to reprimand or dismiss any camper or faculty member who does not conform to these guidelines.**
